


Meth Prevention Education Planning Toolkit for Community Educators & Teachers

A toolkit of materials that help educate people about methamphetamine, its impacts and how communities can respond. The toolkit includes:





Bookmark. Great for mailing and distributing with a display. Full-color, double-sided on card stock; 3.63" x 8.5"




11 x 17 color poster with contact information and space for customized local contact information.
