

NIFA PARTNERSHIP AWARDS PROGRAM

PURPOSE

To annually recognize exemplary work from a team or individual at a land-grant university or other cooperating institution or organization supported by the National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA). This program will allow recognition of outstanding contributions in support of the NIFA mission that provide an outcome that positively impacts agriculture, the environment, communities or people.

CATEGORIES

This awards program recognizes outstanding outcomes in the following four categories:

Category I – *Mission Integration of Research, Education, or Extension*

This involves implementation of a program or project which incorporates, in a meaningful way, full integration of research, education, or extension and results in a positive outcome that impacts agriculture, the environment, communities or people.

Category II – *Multistate Efforts*

The program or project must show a partnership with two or more states that responds to critical needs important to each state. It must show how the states contributed by providing enhancement in breadth or depth of resources to the program. The fiscal relationships should represent equity in access and distribution of resources and the individuals or team must show a commitment to evaluation of the impact in all states participating.

Category III – *Innovative Program Models*

The program or project should impress the reviewers with response to an issue or need that combines resources (including disciplines) in new ways and/or develops an unusual response to a common problem. The program or project should include response to adverse or critical/emerging regional or national issues, or engagement of stakeholders or customers in program planning or implementation. A positive outcome that impacts agriculture, the environment, communities or people in solving a problem or issue should be evident.

Category IV – *Effective and Efficient Use of Resources*

This would include projects or programs that improved efficiency and effectiveness and resulted in a positive outcome that will have a lasting impact by using:

- Partnerships
- Technologies
- Prioritization of programs / budget allocation
- Reduction of obsolete, or less used, programs
- Innovation

- Risk-taking

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for these awards, nominees must be from a land-grant university or other cooperating institution or organization supported by NIFA.

For team awards, all members of the team must have played a substantial or significant role or made a significant contribution to the work of the project or program. Nominations must include brief but specific documentation of the substantial or significant role of each team member. **Team award nominations are limited to a maximum of 35 members. Nominations listing more than 35 members including the team lead will be disqualified.**

All nominations must be related to programs or projects that have been in place for **at least three of the last five calendar years**.

Each nomination must include a synopsis of the following:

1. Situation to which the program or project responded.
2. Objectives/goals (including expected outcomes).
3. Research, education, or extension project or program developed.
4. What was done (brief).
5. Method(s) for evaluating impact.
6. Measurable outcomes realized to date.

All nominations must be approved and endorsed by the Dean, Director, or Administrator for the lead institution(s). Team awards do not need the signature of the Dean, Director, or Administrator of every person on the team, but at least one Dean or Director must vouch for all team members and must sign the nomination form signifying approval of the nomination of all team members involved.

Nominations may be submitted from land-grant universities and other cooperating institutions and organizations supported by NIFA.

NIFA employees are not eligible to submit nominations but can be a part of a nomination submitted by a partner institution.

There can be a maximum of 2 nominations total (combined total across all categories) from any one institution, meaning the entire institution – including research, education, and extension as part of one entire institution.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Nominations must demonstrate how an individual or group pro-actively excelled in one of the four categories listed above.

Nominations must clearly and succinctly be written to demonstrate the following characteristics:

1. Exemplary program impact, including appropriate evaluation of outcomes. Include critical or unique impacts in particular.
2. National or international recognition.
3. Ongoing efforts; the program or project must have been in place for at least 3 of the last 5 calendar years.
4. Identification of the relevant NIFA contact such as a National Program Leader.

NOMINATION AND SELECTION PROCEDURES

Nominations must be submitted using the attached form. Justifications must clearly and concisely address the selection criteria shown above.

All signed nomination forms must be submitted by July 12, 2010, via email using scanned files that have been saved as .pdf or .jpg files to Mary Oxner at mary.oxner@ars.usda.gov

A selection panel will evaluate the nominations and rank nominees in each respective category. The selection panel will focus on the significance, impact and outcome of the accomplishments and achievements of those nominated. The panel's recommendations will be forwarded to the NIFA Director for final review and approval. Nominators and nominees cannot be a part of the selection process.

NATURE OF RECOGNITION

All awardees will be recognized at the annual NIFA Day of Appreciation tentatively scheduled for October 6, 2010.
